Helpful Hints:

1. A reminder that prior to the use of your swag, you should remove the mattress and thoroughly hose down the canvas so as to make the stitching “swell” and the canvas “shrink”. In conjunction with this and after drying the swag I recommend a recognised canvas Seam Sealer agent to be applied along the base line where the main flyscreen of your swag is sewn into the top of the swag (about knee height). This will assist in stopping any seepage (**this is a MUST DO!**) the degree of usage will determine the frequency of water proofing in specified areas of your swag. Failure to do this may result in the swag leaking when it rains. It normally takes several “wets” to get the maximum sealing effect.
2. In the event of extreme cold weather I also recommend you drop the foot swag poles to minimise the effects of condensation build up. By doing this the heat tends to be forced up to the head of the swag thus allowing the air to escape through the head window (*which should be slightly opened*).
3. In the likelihood of rain, prior to access, lower your foot poles, do up you Velcro at the top of the swag, then reposition you foot poles. This will make the canvas have a “springboard” effect ensuring run off of water. From here access the swag through the head end (*Lite-Rider exempt*)
NOTE: Swags should be fully erect in free standing position in adverse weather.
4. Initially setting up your rope ties attach rope to both head eyelets, at the centre of the “V” create a loop so that your peg can be placed into. At the foot end attach your rope ties to each eyelet and splay them outside the line of the swag when erected.

 - a) Lite-Rider only, the “V” configuration at the head end is reversed.
 - b) Roy-L-Duel has 3 eyelets at foot end. The centre eyelet is to assist in raising the centre of the swag. Place a “bush stick” in this eyelet to raise fabric, higher.
6. In transit ensure PVC base is protected from “rubbing” against sharp objects. Place some protection material around the rolled up swag.
7. **DO NOT** use any cleaning detergents on the swag. Hose down only with water to clean.
8. After use, do not leave swag rolled up with moisture in it. When in double “dry it out!”
9. **Warning: The rope ties can be a trip hazard, when swag is fully erected. Take care when moving around the swag.**
